Message -1 Walking on High Places

Habakkuk's Experience

10 April 2023, 10:30-11:30

Habakkuk and God

Context:

In 721 BC Kingdom of Israel was taken captive by Assyrian Kingdom.

Around 625BC, Kingdom of Judah rejected God. As a result wickedness and evil was on rampant. There was violence, iniquity, grievance, lawlessness and no judgment. It was an extremely unpleasant time.



Habakkuk and God

During that time Habakkuk wrote his book. It is an interesting book in the sense that the writer had a message for himself from the Lord and he wrote it in his book. It was a personal account or testimony. Interestingly, the book of Habakkuk has a close association with the meaning of the name of the writer.

Habakkuk means "wrestled" or "embraced".

He "wrestled" with God and finally "embraced" God.

Habakkuk Wrestled With God

Wondered -

Why are you not hearing me? Habakkuk questioned the Lord, "How long shall I cry and Thou wilt not hear?" (Habakkuk 1:2). Habakkuk thought that the Lord is indifferent, not bothered about wickedness the people of God and therefore not doing anything!

God answered him, "I will work a work" (1:5-11).

The sinful Jonah will be punished. I will punish them by the Babylonian king, Nebuchadnezzar!

Why do you use the wicked people to punish more righteous people than them? Habakkuk asked God, "Thou art of purer eyes than to behold evil, and canst not look on iniquity wherefore lookest thou upon them that deal treacherously, and holdest thy tongue when the wicked devoureth the man that is more righteous than he?" Habakkuk (1: 13).

Habakkuk Wrestled With God

Watched -

Habakkuk waited on the Lord and watched Him to give a solution to his puzzles. He thought, what will the Lord say and what will I answer? Habakkuk waited, "I will stand upon my watch, and set me upon the tower, and will watch to see what he will say unto me, and what I shall answer when I am reproved" Habakkuk 2:1

Habakkuk Wrestled With God

GOD answered: It was a vision for the appointed time

- 1. **The Just shall live by faith** (Habakkuk 2:4) The righteous God justified His judgements. Proud will be punished, just will live by faith.
- 2. The earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of God (Habakkuk 2:14) Though the earth was filled with the violence, wickedness and evil, the Lord would fill it with the knowledge of the glory of God.
- 3. **The Lord is in His holy Temple** (Habakkuk 2:20) Though the kingdom of Judah failed and seemingly the wicked kingdoms were raising, ultimately the Lord is reigning from His Temple and He is in control of everything.

Habakkuk's bewilderment was gone and his puzzle was solved when he understood the vision and understood God.

Habakkuk Embraced God

Habakkuk was

Enlightened (Understood God):

God is the Righteous - He is not indifferent but will judge the proud.

God of Glory - He will make earth be filled with the knowledge of the Glory of God. He gives glory to His people inlace of the shame.

God is Sovereign, the Ruler - He is the King reigning from His Temple.

Habakkuk Embraced God

Encountered (Related himself to God):

■ Prayed God to revive His work (Habakkuk 3:2)

O LORD, I have heard thy speech, and was afraid: O LORD, revive thy work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make known; in wrath remember mercy. Habakkuk 3:2

- God is God of my Salvation (Habakkuk 3:18)
- God is God of my Strength (Habakkuk 3:19)

Habakkuk Embraced God

Habakkuk was

Experienced (God's work in him):

Rejoiced in the joy of Salvation (Habakkuk 3:18)

Walked on his high places with the strength of God who make his feet like hinds feet (Habakkuk 3:19)

Although the ¹fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall ²fruit be in the vines; the ³labour of the olive shall fail, and the ⁴fields shall yield no meat; the ⁵flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be ⁶no herd in the stalls: Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. The LORD God is my strength, and he will make my feet like hinds' feet, and he will make me to walk upon mine high places. Habakkuk 3;17-19.

Knowing God

You can make Habakkuk's experience as your experience and you can walk on your high places.

1. Know who God is:

No one can understand or know God unless He reveals Himself to us. God Revealed Himself in three ways:

- a. CREATION (General Revelation): God revealed Himself through the creation He created (Psalms 19:1-3; Romans 1:19-20; Acts 17:24-30)
- b. SPOKEN or WRITTEN WORD (Special Revelation):
 SPOKEN WORD (Hebrew **Dabar**) Exodus 3:14; Exodus 6:3; 1 Samuel 3:7, 21
 WRITTEN WORD (Greek **Logos**) Deuteronomy 6:4
- c. JESUS CHRIST (Special Revelation): Jesus Christ came into the world to reveal who God is: John 1:18; Colossians 1:15-17; John 14:9 (See 1 Corinthians 4:4-6)

Knowing God

GOD IS

1. Great (Transcendent - Greatness):

Omnipotent; Omniscient; Omnipresent Eternal, Sovereign Spirit

2. Good (Immanent - Goodness):

Love, Merciful, Gracious, Kind Faithful, Gentle, Long-suffering Holy, Righteous, Just

Embracing God

To make Habakkuk's experience as your experience, you need to embrace God through Salvation experience.

THE MESSAGE TO HABAKKUK WAS - "THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH" (Habakkuk 2:4)

Romans 1:17; Galatians 3:11 and Hebrews 10:38 - IT SPEAKS OF SALVATION EXPERIENCE

SALVATION EXPERIENCE

- a. NEW BIRTH "Born-again" or "new birth" can be experienced by accepting Lord Jesus Christ as your personal saviour (John 3: 1-13; John 1:12-13; 1 Peter 1:23; 1 John 5:1) Without this experience you can not relate yourself to God.

 Christ was born in this world for you.
- b. FORGIVENESS Pardon or Remission for sins (Ephesians 1:7; Matthew 9:2-6; Hebrews 9:22). Forgiveness for sins can be received through repentance or confession of sins (1 John 1:9) Without forgiveness of sins you are enemy to God without peace (Isaiah 1:18).

 Christ shed His blood for the remission of your sins.
- c. JUSTIFICATION Punishment of sins is taken away Not being under the condemnation of eternal hellfire John 3:18; John 5:24; John 5:24; John 5:24; Romans 5:18; Romans 8:1. Without justification you are under the wrath of God condemned to eternal hellfire.

 Christ took your punishment.

Embracing God

SALVATION EXPERIENCE (CONTD)

- a. REDEMPTION Deliverance from the bondage (of Satan and Sin) 1 Peter 1:18, 19; Colossians 1:13. Without redemption, you are in the power of darkness, slave to sin. Christ paid the price of your redemption.
- b. QUICKENED Made alive (Ephesians 2:1-5). Without quickening, you are dead in your sins and trespasses.

Christ died and rose again to revive the dead spirit.

Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. The LORD God is my strength, and he will make my feet like hinds' feet, and he will make me to walk upon mine high places. Habakkuk 3:18-19

Embracing God

SALVATION RESULTS IN -

Yet I will <u>rejoice</u> in the LORD, I will <u>joy</u> in the God of my salvation. The LORD God is my strength, and he will make my <u>feet like hinds' feet</u>, and he will make me to <u>walk upon mine high places</u>.

Habakkuk 3:18-19

- JOY Joy of salvation (Psalm 51:); It is unspeakable and full of glory (1 Peter 1:9)
 It makes you REJOICE (Habakkuk 3:18)
- 2. HOPE In tough times Because God is Sovereign and King (in control of every situation, Habakkuk 2: 20) Walk upon high places.
- 3. Many other things such as Life (New, Abundant and eternal), Peace etc.

Jacob's Experience (Deuteronomy 32:10-14)

Jacob and God

Context: People of Israel have come out of Egypt and wandered in the wilderness for forty years. Moses spoke to the second generation mostly born during the wilderness journey.

The book of Deuteronomy is the message of God to Israelites including todays passage Deuteronomy 32: 10-14. It tells us about the life of Jacob also.

Jacob mean supplanter.

But God transformed him to be **Israel** (prevail with God or God prevails) It is a perfect story of man and God working together to prevail!

Jacob and God

Deuteronomy 32: 10-13

He **found him** in a ¹desert land, and in the waste howling wilderness; he ²led him about, he ³**instructed him**, he ⁴kept him as the apple of his eye. As an eagle stirreth up her nest, fluttereth over her young, spreadeth abroad her wings, taketh them, beareth them on her wings: So the ⁵LORD alone did lead him, and there was no strange god with him. ⁶He made him ride on the high places of the earth, that he might eat the increase of the fields; and ⁷he made him to suck honey out of the rock, and oil out of the flinty rock;

Jacob and God

1. GOD FOUND JACOB

Desert land and in howling wilderness (lonely, exposed to dangers, vulnerable and helpless...)

2. GOD TRAINED JACOB

Led him about, instructed him, he kept him as the apple of his eye; LORD alone did lead him,

3. GOD MADE HIM TO RIDE UPON HIGH PLACES

He made him ride on the high places of the earth ...he made him to suck honey out of the rock, and oil out of the flinty rock;

Unlike Habakkuk's personal account in his book, this is God's account of Jacob.

Making Jacob's experience as yours

God trained and made Jacob to be transformed in the world Jacob lived.

God made him to ride upon high places.

The Lord would like to train you in two aspects as he trained Jacob and transformed him:

- 1) Your World and
- 2) Your nature

Making Jacob's experience as yours

Let us consider Jacob's world and his nature that the Lord transformed.

Jacob's World:

- It was the world of the children of Heth lived. Heth was the progenitor of "Hittites".
- Heth means "fear" and Hittites represent "doubts" and "no religion"
- **■** Esau gave-in or yielded to the norms of the Hittites, when he married the daughters of Heth (Genesis 27:46)
- It was the society with "no fear of God" and "no religion" like modern Atheism.
- Esau did not care about birthright and God's blessings (Hebrews 12:16-17)

Making Jacob's experience as yours

Jacob's World:

Jacob lived in such a Godless world. Probably, there was a pressure on him to be conformed to its norms, as a young man.

However, Jacob did not give in, so he invited troubles. He stayed at home with his mother and father (Genesis 25:27).

Making Jacob's experience as yours

Your world:

World (Cosmos) is a system operated by Satan and is against God.

The present world is a broken world, full of darkness - sin and evil:

- O Galatians 1:4
- O Philippians 2:15-16
- O Acts 2:40
- O 1 John 2:15-16

It was hostile to the Lord Jesus Christ and also to a child of God. In fact the world around you hates you, if you are a child of God (John 17:14). You can either be conformed to it or be transformed (Romans 12: 1-2). There is a peer pressure every child of God experiences. If you do not confirmed to the dominating norms of the society or the world around you, you'll be isolated. You are "not cool" but a "looser".

Making Jacob's experience as yours

Your nature:

We have inherited a nature from Adam and Eve which is called a "fallen nature" (Romans 5: 12; 15; 19). It is represented as a "old man" in the Bible (Romans 6:6).

We are naturally inclined to sin (Ephesians 2:2-3):

Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others.

Your nature:

Three categories of nature of a person:

Natural

- Spirit is dead
- Body is defiled
- Soul darkened

Carnal

- Spirit is alive but weak
- Body is active
- Soul is active

Spiritual

- Spirit is alive and strong
- Body is subjected to spirit
- Soul is subjected to spirit

Galatians 5:18, 19

Youthful lusts (2 Timothy 2:22)

Mortifying the deeds of the flesh Romans 8:13; Colossians 3:5

 - O Trusted God (Found a perfect security in God Psalm 18: 1-3; 16-24)

Target - Your will (Isaiah 14:12-1; 1 Timothy 3:6)





Purpose - To make you impatient with God

Your defence - Imparted Grace of God (1 Peter 5:10); Work of the cross (Galatians 2:20; 5:24; 6:14)

Walk Upon My High Places

Habakkuk 3: 17-19

Though the fig tree does not blossom
And there is no fruit on the vines,
Though the yield of the olive fails
And the fields produce no food,
Though the flock is cut off from the fold
And there are no cattle in the stalls,

Yet I will [choose to] rejoice in the Lord;
I will [choose to] shout in exultation in the [victorious] God of my salvation!

The Lord God is my strength [my source of courage, my invincible army];

He has made my feet [steady and sure] like hinds' feet

And makes me walk [forward with spiritual confidence] on my [a]high places [of challenge and responsibility].
